It is crucial that all families log on over the next fortnight (including all families with a student in Year 6), as student reports will only be available electronically through Compass at the end of the school year. Student reports will no longer be printed at school for distribution.

If by chance you have misplaced your Compass letter with your initial password details, please call the main office or email Belinda (gill.belinda.a@edumail.vic.gov.au) for these details as soon as possible. When logged on for the first time, you will then be able to personalise your password details.

In addition to accessing student reports, you will now have the ease of registering your child's absences from school via Compass. months, we aim to ensure that all communication processes with the school are seamless and accessible for everyone.

YEAR LEVEL ROOM ALLOCATIONS

With our growing enrolments, it has become increasingly difficult to cluster each year level in classrooms that are adjacent to each other. For the first time next year, we will have five classes at every level up to Year 3 and four classes at Year 4. Unfortunately our class numbers for 2016 do not align with our building configuration and so you will note in the allocations below that there will be two sections of the school where grades within a particular level will be separated.

The following provides an overview of the year level placement's for 2016:

Preps – Junior Learning Centre (same as 2015)

Year One – Rooms 3 to 7 (main building and one portable classroom)

Year Two – Rooms 1 & 2 (near the staffroom) and Rooms 15 – 17 (near the Gymnasium)

Year Three – Rooms 18 – 22 (mainly portable classrooms towards Burgoyne Lane)

Year Four – New Double Storey Facility

Year Five - Rooms 9 & 10 (upstairs in the main building) and Room 23 (next to the art room)

Year Five/Six – Room 11

Year Six – Rooms 12 – 14 (upstairs in the main building)

Just to complicate the matter a little more, we have renumbered our classrooms next year as the current numbering system has evolved over recent years and the arrival of six new classrooms for 2016 has prompted a more coordinated and logical approach to our numbering system. We will publish the new map when all of these details have been confirmed.

In next week's newsletter, we will also publish the staff who will be teaching at each year level of the school in 2016.

TWILIGHT CAROLS

I hope everyone has Wednesday 16th December locked into their phone calendars for our upcoming Twilight Carols. We have our fingers crossed for a lovely summer's evening for the performances that will get underway from 7.00pm in the school grounds.

The introduction of our Twilight Carols is part of a detailed community engagement strategy that aims to ensure a very coordinated approach to all of our major activities and social events every two years.

Next year, we will host a major Musical and an Art Show as we focus on a year that will promote the arts across the school and throughout the community. The following year, we will start the cycle again with our Fete and Twilight Carols as our major events for the year, and so on.

The ultimate aim of our two yearly community engagement planner is to ensure that all families are able to maximise their participation in the school's many extra curricula activities.

School Banking School banking day is Wednesday. Don't forget to send in your child's bank book.

Student Safety Please take the time to regularly remind your child/ren about safety, especially when going to and from school. Here are the important points to mention:

- Do not to talk to strangers and never accept a ride from a stranger, or accept lollies or gifts from a stranger.
- Immediately report any issue or problem you may have when going to or from school, to your mum and dad, or to your teacher, the Principal, Assistant Principal or office staff.
- Always get permission from mum or dad before going to play with a friend after school and always let mum and dad know where you will be and what time you will be home.

We advise that, wherever possible, children should travel to or from school with an adult or with their friends, rather than travel alone.

Early Release All children collected from school before 3.30pm must be signed out at the Office. Parents will be handed an 'Early Release Pass' to hand to the supervising teacher. If a child is signed out at Recess or Lunch time, the Office staff will call the child to the Office and then ensure the Early Release Pass is given to the supervising teacher.

Bikes & Scooters Many children ride bikes and scooters to school each day. All bikes and scooters must be locked up in either the Bike or Scooter Enclosure to prevent theft. Please ensure your child has a chain and a lock. All children who ride a bike or scooter must wear a helmet which is a requirement by the Government . The school regularly reminds all children about wearing helmets for their safety. All bikes, scooters, skateboards, ribtics and helmets must be labelled, with your child's name and class. **Children are reminded they must walk their bike, scooter, skateboard or ribstic to and from the school gates. No bikes are to be brought through the school buildings and we request, where possible, that Scooters are also not walked through the building.**

Working With Children Checks

Cardholders who are required to renew their WWC Check will no longer need to go to Australia Post to lodge a paper form and present their current card. Cardholders will go to the WWC Check website to complete their renewal application online and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the fee using a credit card. **The online renewal process** Cardholders will be notified by SMS, letter or email 28 days before their WWC Check is due to expire. It is important for cardholders to keep their contact details up to date so that they receive this important reminder.

After receiving a notification, individuals continuing to do child-related work should go to MyCheck on the WWC Check website and apply to renew their Check. Cardholders will be asked to register with MyCheck if they have not already done so. Once logged in to MyCheck, cardholders will be prompted to confirm or update their personal contact and work details, complete the online form and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the non-refundable \$102.70 fee.

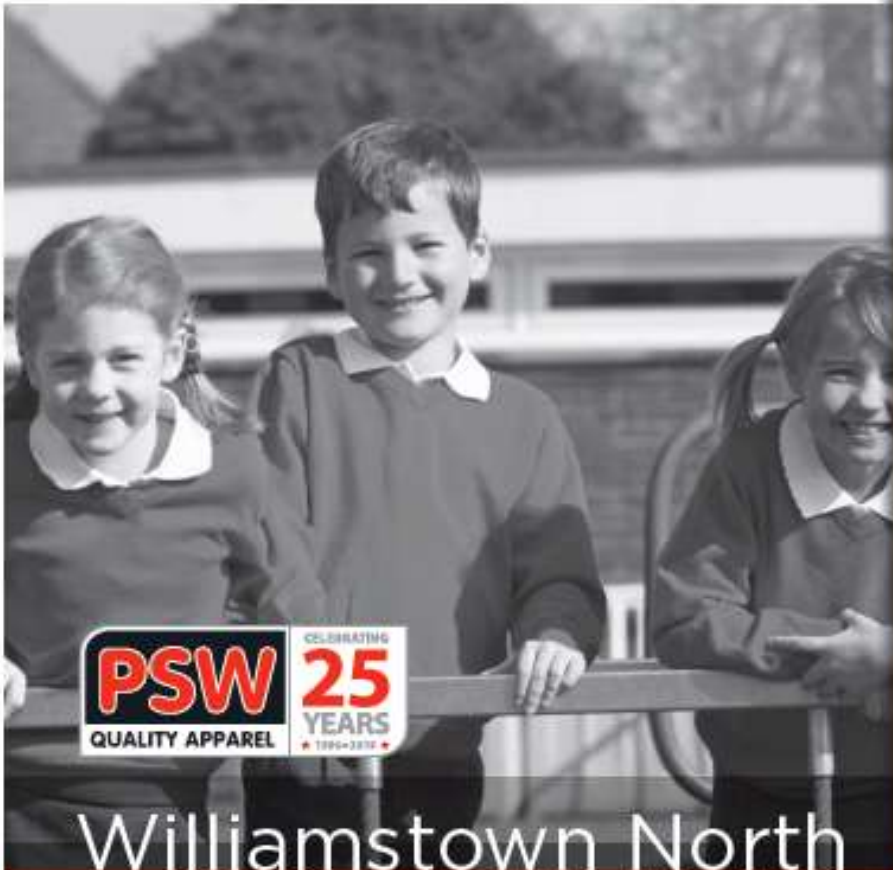

WEDNESDAY 2 DECEMBER 2015

Any transition period is a critical time for a young person, often evoking a variety of emotions, behaviours and concerns for both young people and their parents. For many, these transition periods are considered a major stepping stone on the way to becoming an adult.
