Junior School Council Policy

Date: April 2010

1. Rationale

- **1.1** Williamstown North Primary School strongly supports the development of student Leadership Skills.
- **1.2** At our school the Junior School Council will represent the student body in raising, discussing, reporting and acting upon relevant student issues.

2. Aims

- **2.1** To provide a forum where student issues and concerns can be raised on a regular basis.
- **2.2** To develop Leadership Skills in students elected from Years 3/4 and 5/6.
- **2.3** To represent their peers via Junior School Council, where issues concerning the school are raised and discussed.
- **2.4** To assist with fundraising activities that support charities.
- **2.5** To assist with whole school events such as RTIM and Footy Week etc.

3 Implementation

- **3.1** Each 3/4 and 5/6 class elects a male and female Representative and a male and female Vice Representative.
- **3.2** Representatives meet on a regular basis at a designated time.
- **3.3** Two Junior School Council representatives attend a meeting at Hobson's bay Council each month.
- **3.4** A male and female are elected from the representative body to report outcomes of meetings to the Principal/Assistant Principal.
- 3.5 Each elected representative is responsible for giving their class and their designated Prep or Year 1/2 class an opportunity to provide ideas, issues or concerns to take back to the meetings.
- **3.6** Junior School Council members are invited to attend a designated School Council meeting during the year.

4 Evaluation/Review

- **4.1** The program will be carefully monitored and changes made where appropriate. This will occur via the Professional Learning Teams, Leadership Team and the Well-being Key Reference Group.
- **4.2** Annual program evaluation will occur to assess strengths and improvement opportunities.
- **4.3** This Policy will be reviewed in-line with the School Review process.
